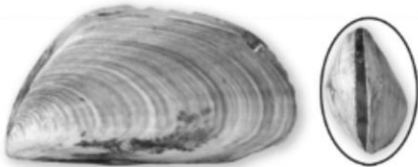


**Quagga Mussels** Ave. size: 2”

Light tan to almost white, usually dark concentric rings on shell, paler in color near the hinge. Topples over; will not sit flat on ventral side, rounder in shape, typically larger than zebra mussel.

Found: Lakes, reservoirs. Attaches to hard surfaces using byssal threads, may also partially bury in sediment.



**Native mussels do not attach to surfaces.**



**Zebra Mussels** Ave. size: 1”

Color varies: black-brown to white-yellow, zigzagged pattern. Shell is D-shaped. Sits flat on ventral side, triangular in shape, byssal threads are on the hinge edge of its shell.

Found: Lakes, reservoirs, and slow moving waters. Attaches to rocks, wood, cement, watercraft, or any other hard surfaces.
